Our Solution

1. We meet with decision-makers to discuss priorities and constraints. We use this information to identify different technologies that address gaps in the current systems. Though budget is one of the constraints we answer to, we don't eliminate the options solely on cost.
2. We assess the technologies that have the best fit to the environment. Typically we identify 3 or 4 and document their pros and cons, as specific to the school. Then we do a comparison of their alignment to the client's priorities. The final report is presented to the decision-makers.
3. If the client is interested, we set up and facilitate demos. We also make suggestions on sourcing funding and providing data to support the need.
